Please note as advised by the The Hon Mark Coulton MP Minister for Regional Health, Regional Communications and Local Government Everyone who downloads the COVIDSafe app can be assured their privacy is protected by law.

The Minister for Health, the Hon Greg Hunt MP, has issued a Determination under the Biosecurity Act which protects privacy. It restricts access to app data to state and territory health authorities who will notify people exposed to COVID-19. It will be a criminal offence to use app data in any other way.

COVID-19 WA roadmap

Phase 1 27 April 2020

- Gatherings limit raised from 2 to 10 people
- Some additional non-contact public activities permitted
- Soft start to Term 2 for public schools introduced
- Home opens permitted in accordance with the limit on gatherings
- Weddings and funerals, up to 10 people
- Outdoor personal training (no shared equipment) up to 10 people

Phase 2 18 May 2020

- Non-work gatherings limit raised to 20 people
- Weddings and funerals up to 20 people inside or 50 outside
- People are encouraged to return to work, unless they are unwell or vulnerable
- Travel restrictions relaxed, travel permitted between:
 1. Perth, Peel, Wheatbelt, South West & Great Southern
 2. Mid West, Gascoyne & Pilbara*
 3. Within the Goldfields-Esperance region*
 4. Local Government Areas in the Kimberley*
- Public events permitted to open with strict rules
- Cafes and restaurants permitted to reopen with meal services, including within pubs, clubs, hotels and casinos, up to 20 patrons, with the 1.5m rule applied
- Places of worship, libraries, community centres & community facilities may reopen, with a 20 patron limit
- Indoor and outdoor fitness and dance classes allowed, with a 20 participant limit, minimal shared equipment and 1.5m rule applied
- Non-contact community sport and training allowed, with a 20 person limit

Phase 3 Around 4 weeks after Phase 2

- Further increases in non-work gatherings
- Contact community sport
- Beauty therapy services
- Public playgrounds, skate parks, cinemas and concert venues

Phase 4 Future easing of restrictions will be determined and occur in line with expert health advice

Additional Info:

- Avoid close contact with others: Keep at least 1.5 metres away
- Healthy hygiene: Wash your hands regularly, Cover your mouth/nose when you cough/sneeze
- 4 square metres per person
- Download the COVIDSafe app

PROPOSED ROAD CLOSURE AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION & COMMENT

PORTION OF GREAT NORTHERN HIGHWAY ABUTTING CROWN RESERVE NO.7615 BEING THE SEVEN MILE WELL NATURE RESERVE, YARAWINDAH

Notice is hereby given that the Victoria Plains Shire Council has resolved, pursuant to Section 58 of the *Land Administration Act 1997*, to close a 3,881m² portion of Great Northern Highway in the locality of Yarawindah to allow the land to be amalgamated with the Seven Mile Well Nature Reserve (i.e. Crown Reserve 7615) located immediately west.

Documents and plans setting out and explaining the proposal are available for inspection on the Public Notices section of the Shire's website (www.victoriaplains.wa.gov.au).

Comments on the proposal are now invited and can be emailed to reception@victoriaplains.wa.gov.au or posted to the Shire's Chief Executive Officer at PO Box 21 CALINGIRI WA 6569. All submissions must include the following information:

- Your name, address and contact telephone number;
- How your interests are affected whether as a private citizen, on behalf of a company or other organisation, or as an owner or occupier of property;
- Address of property affected (if applicable); and
- Whether your submission is in support of or objecting to the proposal, either in part or in whole, and any reasons supporting your comments.

Comments on the proposal may be submitted to the local government on or before **Wednesday 17 June 2020**.

All submissions received may be made public at a Council meeting and included in a Council Agenda, which will be available on the Shire's website in due course, unless a submission specifically requests otherwise.
