Definitions:

Spontaneous Volunteers is a non-registered volunteer who occasionally attends bushfires to assist. These volunteers are critical to the expedient response and reducing the initial spread of bushfire.

Bush Fire Volunteers are volunteer firefighters who actively attend and contribute to a bush fire brigade. These volunteers have minimum standards for attendance at training, meetings, and skills development. Bushfire Volunteers are critical to the effective operation of Shire supplied fire appliances.

Fire Control Officers both Chief, Deputy and general are expected to manage incidents within their respective areas, as a Fire Control Officer, there is a high expectation of skills and ability to lead all personnel on the incident ground.
