From the Shire President

A leap year gave us a bonus day in February. Did you make it count?

My last 2 days of February were filled with meetings and training.

Thank you to Councillor Woods, Lovelock, and Johnson for joining me at the training session on financial statements. It was a opportune time to refresh ourselves on our monthly financial reporting. The Australian Accounting Standards sets the format for the Shire's monthly reports, and it's become much easier to make comparisons across the sector when all local governments report in the same method.

The Audit Committee met on the 28th of February, and we received an update on the Shire's risk management procedures. Since our last update, the Shire has been striving to provide a solid platform where progress on the various risk treatments can be made. We have 15 risk profiles and progress is recorded in the risk dashboard.

The 2nd budget review for 23-24 has been conducted with a conservative approach. Results continue to head in a positive direction with a current forecast surplus of \$128,159.

At the February Council Meeting, we established a reserve for unallocated monies to address the one remaining management audit finding from the 22-23 financial report. It's a timely reminder that payees should include their reference number and specific details when processing online payments to the Shire. This will enable efficient reconciliation and reduce the need to allocate money to this reserve.

Council was pleased to accept the request from the Mogumber Progress Association, to rename the Mogumber Library as The Janice Coxon Memorial Library, Mogumber. Mrs Janice Coxon was instrumental in the lobbying for the third classroom from the Mogumber Primary School to not be relocated as the other classrooms were. She then created and opened what is currently known as the Mogumber Library and Post Office.

Council deferred the agenda item regarding the renaming of the Calingiri Federation Memorial Park to the Shire of Victoria Plains War Memorial. Community Consultation will be undertaken to ensure the community of Victoria Plains understands the sentiment behind the proposed name change and the item will be brought back to Council within 2 months.

And on that bonus day of Feb 29th, I chaired the Shire's Local Emergency Management Committee. We continue to lobby the telecommunication providers for a better standard of communication during power outages. We also continued the discussion on fit for purpose fire trucks and continue to lobby for equipment such as central tyre inflations kits.

I hope you enjoy the cooler March weather. Gee wizz it's been a hot summer.

Hello From the CEO

I have been on leave since the February Council meeting. We went down south to attend a wedding in Margaret River and then spent time travelling around the south-west region, noting much of what many local governments have undertaken in the last two to three years. One aspect that is impacting there the same as here, is the lack of water and the very dry conditions.

Of course there has now been further major flooding in the Goldfields region and heavy rainfalls again in the north of the State. Our thoughts are with these communities.

Economic Development Strategy

As per my update in the last newsletter, the development of the economic development strategy is proceeding as required. An email has now been sent out to key stakeholders advising them they will be receiving a survey from Econosis to assist develop the Shire's economic development strategy. The key stakeholders consist of community and sporting groups, the schools, first nations people, major employers and business owners.

The purpose of the online survey is to gauge views on the opportunities and challenges facing the Victoria Plains economy now and into the future. Econosis will then be holding meetings with some of the key stakeholders and will also be meeting with Council and key Shire staff within the next two weeks.

The strategy will include an implementation plan and will be aligned to take advantage of key funding opportunities.

AROC - Dandaragan Workforce Housing Investigation Project

A big thank you to those who participated in the survey to identify key worker housing needs across the Shire. The next part of the process is engaging with organisations such as the WA Police, WA Country Health, Western Power, the Department of Education and so on regarding their housing needs.

The project group will be meeting shortly to review the survey data and also the suggested locations in each Shire for the development of suitable land and construction of dwellings.

Corella Management

As some of you may have noticed, the corellas are back in substantial numbers. At this point in time we have instigated a culling program to help address part of the problem.

The President and I attended the recent AROC meeting that also had a presentation from the Corella Coordinator, Jacquie Lucas. This role is housed within NRM Wheatbelt and is funded jointly by CBH, WEROC and AROC. Jacquie was able to confirm the following developments:

- 204 responses have been received re the Corella survey. No analysis of data has been undertaken as yet.
- Focus since inception in October 2023 has been on meeting the requirements of CBH. A drone project has been trialled in some areas. All local governments now on board.
- Preparing business case to apply for a permit to use Alpha-Chloralose. This substance produces a hypnotic effect by anaesthetising the animal's brain. This means it can be used allowing the removal of corellas while asleep. Other birds affected will then wake up and fly away.

From the Deputy Chief Executive Officer Colin Ashe



Hello to all subscribers of the newsletter,

My team is in full swing now for the new year and working towards a number of major projects. At the start of the financial year I predicted this would be a heavy year as we planned to do a number of activities, some of which have been left for too long and the imminent need for change is upon us. To their credit, whilst at times I'm sure they ask themselves 'what are we doing this for', for the most part they are handling the change extremely well.

As per previous newsletters the major projects for my team includes the New Computer Operating system (ERP) and the Sport and Recreation Master Plan (SRMP). The former should not be under-estimated as to complexities, work involved and effort on staff (given normal operations needs to continue) but so far so good. Improvements and efficiencies are starting to crystallise and the more exposure, the better the outcome.

Finance Update 23-24

The budgeted activities for 2023-24 are progressing well with the majority ahead of schedule or on track for completion. The Shire recently completed its statutory budget review and at this stage we anticipate a modest budget surplus and there are no indications of any capital works having to be deferred. As at the 30 Jan 24 the following progress has been made on Capital Activities:

As per the separate advertisement, there has been a requirement to create a new Reserve Account to address a management audit finding from 2022-23. This is the last item to be addressed out of the seven (7) found from 2021-22.

In Mar 24 we will start the budget process for 2024-25 in consultation with the Community Strategic Plan and some additional items we have since identified through 2023-24.

Other Projects / Strategic Planning

Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) – Records Management module in the new computer system has now gone live. Staff have had some initial training and although change can be daunting, I have no doubt once we get into a rhythm, there will be no looking back. There has also been some progress in the new meetings and agenda software and we are about to launch the new Cemetery on-line software which I think residents and ratepayers will be pleasantly surprised.

Sport and Recreation Master Plan (SRMP) – Submissions for stakeholders closed on the 01 Mar and we had an excellent response (80%) of those invited to participate. The next steps will be further engagement with the consultant to discuss the results, themes, priorities and provision standards with a view to get a draft to council and participants and then ultimately place achievable goals into the 2024-25 budget.

From the Manager Works and Services

Contractors have now completed the 2.58km section of Toodyay Bindi-Bindi Rd through our Regional Road Group program. Works included 100mm top up with new gravel and then wet mixed in to a depth of 300mm with a stabilizing machine from Downer. This incorporates new material into the existing road formation to gain increased strength for an extended road life. Some sections required a cement additive at a 2% ratio to gain the required 98% compaction minimum standard.

Fulton Hogan then completed the 8 meter seal with a 14mm/10mm rubber based seal over the weekend of the 9th and 10th March. Remaining work includes sweeping of loose material, line marking and white delineators/signage.

Additional roadworks will commence the 11th March in Lambert St Calingiri to remove the tree root damage as you approach the oval entrance. This will be done by cutting the invasive tree roots and repairing the areas of road previously raised up. This will then be sealed with a 10mm aggregate over the trenched parts and a 7mm seal over the entire street. This will make the use of the road by all sportsground users a more pleasant experience by not having to drive over multiple speed humps.. Other streets will follow as funding becomes available.

Bolgart Caravan Park has had the two tanks installed for the RV dump point and the plumber can now connect the pipework and access point. A tap and hose will be installed for wash down and clean up as is required by law and a automatic level sensor installed to notify of the tank level when emptying is required.

With many projects currently underway at the Shire for 2024, one I would like to mention is the planning stages of our Sports & Recreation Master Plan.

We have held three community meetings engaging our Community Groups to gather community input on future goals and projects. The feedback, input and engagement we received from the community members has been great to see and extremely valuable.



Little Rippers Dispenser Bags

We are currently trialing dog dispenser bags within Calingiri and Yerecoin for people to use when out exercising their dogs to help owners clean up after their pets. We have one dispenser unit located at the Calingiri Sports Pavilion and the other is located at the Yerecoin Wayside area. These spots have been chosen for the first trial as they are 2 of our most used dog areas. A little information about these bags from the Little Rippers website –

We designed dog waste bags that are eco-friendly and compostable that don't stick together in the heat. They are strong and made of plant-based materials. These bags not only work great for users, but they leave no micro plastic waste when composted, meaning they are great for the soil as well.

With much sadness, the Shire acknowledges the passing of our 2024 Community Citizen of the Year, Scott Metcalfe. The community of Mogumber and the wider district have been devastated by the tragic loss, describing Scott as an irreplaceable asset to the community. At 43 years of age, Scott had given so much to the Shire of Victoria Plains and it was with great pleasure that the Council awarded his Citizen of the year only a few weeks ago, during the Australia Day Breakfast Ceremony. The Shire sends our condolences to his family, friends and community.

The following extract from the Australia Day ceremony proved the love and appreciation the community had for Mr Scott Metcalfe.

This year's winner is a behind the scenes worker and doer, who gets on with the job, without a fuss when things need to be done. He is a real asset to his community and the wider district. Someone who gives generously of their time to make a positive and lasting impact in the community. The list of organisations he has helped in recent years is long.

When Scott moved to Mogumber it was definitely to the benefit of the Mogumber Community. His attention of detail, reliability, knowledge and practical hands-on approach are attributes a small community dreams of.

Upon purchasing his property in 2016, and settling into the town, he immediately involved himself in community activities. He joined the Mogumber & Districts Progress Association, helping out (and organising them) at busy bees. He's picked up rubbish on the side of the road verges, attended many meetings and lent a hand during their open garden fundraiser. In 2018, as part of the Progress Association's fundraising effort, Scott took on a role where the community was paid to clean the toilets at the Mogumber Oval, plus empty the wheelie bins at Hall, the camping area and the Mogumber crossroads. He continued to do that job year after year, single handed for nearly 5 years, including throughout Covid-19. Not only has this work provided considerable fundraising income for the association, but because of Scott's steadfast reliability, these public areas have been maintained to a high level of amenity and tidy appearance.

Scott keeps a regular eye on the water level in the Mogumber Emergency Water supply tank. He's a great supporter of the Mogumber-Gillingarra bush fire brigade and regularly attends their meetings. He can always be relied upon to turn up at a fire and is often there keeping an eye on it till the end. During the 2019 Mogumber Bush Fire, he helped shell shocked landowners deal with livestock. He saw what needed to be done and took on the task before others had to be involved.

Scott also involved himself in the Mogumber Outback Club. During their New Year's Eve Rodeo, he happily volunteers during the 2 weeks of set up and pack down. When there are 3500 people in town and an unplanned situation arises, they turn to Scott the problem solver. He thinks outside the box and finds a solution. In 2022, Scott took the lead role in the Mogumber Arena Building Committee. He prepared scaled plans and organised the installation timeline to ensure the new arena was installed in time for the event. He brought his mini excavator along and dug 356 holes. He arranged the delivery of concrete and led the team through the build.

Just as the arena project was coming to fruition, Scott threw himself into the next MOC project, the Mogumber Hub. He nominated for their volunteer board and is one of the 7 community members helping the Mogumber Outback Club through the renovation of a community owned and operated tavern. Again, his hands on skills have been invaluable. His day-to-day job as a concreter has certainly helped, but it's his passion for the historical elements of the building which has helped the community restore and repurpose where possible. The result is not only a cost saving, but it has produced some significant talking points around the building.

Scott can always see that something needs doing and when it's within his power, he just gets on with it, without a fuss. The standards set by Scott often can't be matched. If the job is going to be done, it's done to the highest standard, which produces a lasting impact for the community.

Scott is a community champion and a deserving winner of the Shire of Victoria Plains Community Citizen of the year award.

Bolgart and Calingiri Cemeteries

Digital Cemetery Platform

The cemetery, by its very nature, is a place of quiet reminiscence, allowing family members to live on in the memories of their lost loved ones and aid in the grieving process. To further connect people with the rich history of the shire's cemeteries and allow families to further celebrate their loved ones, the Shire has implemented a new digital cemetery platform. This system provides information about the Bolgart and Calingiri Cemeteries through an innovative and convenient experience for the public. The platform can be accessed through the links below.

The system is a digital mirror of each cemetery, which allows the Shire to manage cemetery records and share them online. Users can view interments (blue), reservations (yellow) and vacant plots (green). With a user-friendly platform, the online system allows members of the public to access information about their ancestors. Using smartphones and other devices, it is easy to locate specific plots, search for individuals based on name or date of birth and embark on a guided digital walk to the precise burial site.

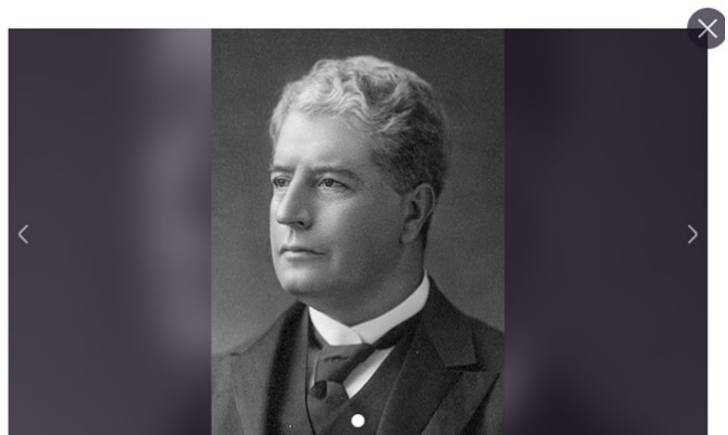
The digital cemetery system also allows families to create a meaningful online memorial with "Life Chronicle" which provides an opportunity to share photos and a story of your loved one's life, leaving an everlasting memory and ongoing connection to their lives and legacy. Interments with "Life Chronicle" stories attached are highlighted in aqua.

The Shire of Victoria Plains is taking this venture one step further by accepting Official Stories to be attached to the plots. If you possess historical information from credible sources, such as published books, you are encouraged to contact the Shire. By incorporating these official narratives, the cemeteries aim to honour the rich history of the region and ensure that future generations can connect with their heritage.

Using a smart phone, users can visit the cemetery revealing hidden stories of families who settled in the area in the. The cemetery is rich in valuable historic resources and reminders of various settlement patterns with connections to the area's original pioneering families.

Life Chronicle submissions can be made directly through the digital cemetery system by clicking on "Write a Life Chronicle". There is a small cost for submissions which is paid directly to the software provider.

Chronicle Official Story

Sir Edmund "Toby" Barton
GCMG, KC (18 January 1849 – 7 January 1920)

Was an Australian politician and judge who served as the first Prime Minister of Australia, in office from 1901 to 1903.

He resigned to become a founding member of the High Court of Australia, where he served until his death. Barton was an early supporter of the federation of the Australian colonies, the goal of which he summarised as "a nation for a continent, and a continent for a nation". After the retirement of

Notification to establish a Financial Reserve Account

In accordance with Section 6.11 of the *Local Government Act 1995* (the Act), the Shire of Victoria Plains is required to provide local public notice of the proposed use of Reserve fund.

1 Purpose

The Shire is proposing to establish a Reserve Account to hold unclaimed / unallocated monies that have been paid to the Shire over a number of years but have been unable to be identified as to what the payment is for.

The Reserve account will be titled Unallocated Monies with the purpose of future refund or allocation once identified or transferred to shire general revenue after the statutory period has expired.

2 Objectives

The establishment of this Reserve fund will:

1. Address the management audit finding by transferring unallocated monies from the suspense account.
2. Will continue to be supported and reconciled by a spreadsheet that provides as much detail as possible on each transaction.
3. Provide a facility where unclaimed / unallocated monies can be transferred back to general revenue after the ten (10) year statutory period.

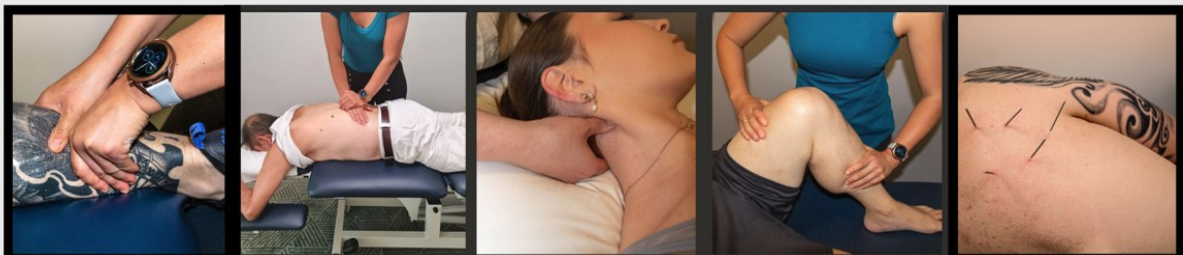

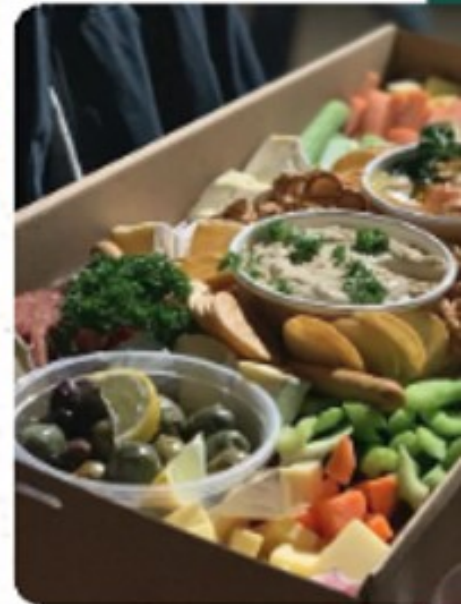
