PURPOSE

Report to Council outlining upcoming Shire projects and disposal of plant.

BACKGROUND

COMMENT

Ag Lime Route

AgLime Route 2 cost assessment has been completed and submitted to Louise Adamson at Main Roads with favourable results for our request for an extra \$78k, a total of \$2.678m. This repair and widening work will be carried out in 2018/19.

RRG Projects

The Shire's MCA for the 2018/19 RRG funding of \$637,410. on the Toodyay-Bindi-Bindi Rd at Bolgart was underpriced, there will be too little money to complete the full program, meaning that some of the re-sealing work won't be done unless funds from other sources can be used.

The re-placement of culverts c/w the fitting of barriers to Austroads standards is a cost that`s been underpriced. A full cost assessment that the total project cost would be over \$900k.

Draft Budget 2018-2019

The Draft Budget will dictate the amount of funds which will be available to spend on roads in 2018/19. The amount which was available in the previous Budget was far short of what was needed for Maintenance Grading, Road-users expectations far out-weighed what the Shire could deliver. Once the draft is available the Councillors should join a bus trip to inspect the roads on our Hierarchy listing and determine where the money should be spent.

Western Riverlands Poultry Intersection

Agreement over the cost of the intersection has continued to drag out despite our efforts to resolve the stalemate. The stumbling block is the difference between the original cost estimates

given by the Shire of \$70-150k for its construction to the \$500k estimated for an Austroads standard Intersection entering a heavily used road such as an AgLime Road-train route like Mogumber West Rd. The agreement between Santrev P/L and the Shire clearly mentions that the construction would be to an engineering standard.

CBH Calingiri

CBH have once more been reminded that a decision before June 30th will be needed if they intend to partner with the Shire with the relocation of the Rail Crossing Intersection adjoining their Calingiri Facility. Main Roads have now approved our 2018/19 AgLime Program, it would need to be a convincing joint approach, with a rock solid guarantee that CBH would fund the difference in the funding allocated for the Intersection upgrade and what it would cost for the relocation.

Old grader

Following a Council decision, the Shire's older Grader will be put up on an On-line Auction in the very near future, Smith Broughton have been selected in preference to Pickles and Manheim.

8.2 EHO/BS REPORT

Shire buildings inspection

Checked a number of them -

- Calingiri Sports Club vested in Shire.
- Significant maintenance and upkeep issues looming.
- Ownership of buildings is often unclear, and accordingly responsibility to maintain the buildings is also uncertain.
- Ownership of the infrastructure as distinct from control of the land needs to be established urgently.
- Also noted was safety and signage issues.

Gym (CEO)

Need an indemnity form, as there are various items that unfamiliar users are potentially at risk. The CEO is working with LGIS to identify and address matters of concern.

Poultry Farm

Working with them extensively to resolve compliance issues.

Mogumber Tavern

Liquor Licencing are working with them to resolve licenced areas.

Stable Fly Action Group

Will need direction from Council in time in relation to control of chicken manure, and the management of large stockpiles, and the resultant stable fly risk. Council may wish to consider joining the SFAG (approx. 11 members).

Some controls exist under regulations, but are limited.

Suggestion from elected members that an education program be undertaken for awareness. Materials provided at the Bolgart meeting will assist.
