Calendars are a part our of life. The farming calendar, the work calendar and our social calendar. The Shire has an extensive 'compliance calendar' that keeps us on track with our requirements. Audits and budgets are some of the important matters we've been progressing of late.

The Audit Committee met with the Shire's Auditors on the 15<sup>th</sup> May. We received the audit strategy memorandum which sets out the focus areas and timeline for the 22-23 audit. The Auditors have visited Victoria Plains to undertake the interim audit. We now work towards the end of financial year and the final audit visit that is due in Oct.

Budget preparations are underway, and Council has set aside a significant block of time to workshop our 23-24 forecast and plan. The yearly budget must link back to the corporate business plan, community strategic plan and our long-term financial plan. I feel confident that our strategic plans are becoming more and more refined, helping us think strategic and link expenditure to the priorities of now and in the future.

It's a busy month ahead for me, with the Avon Regional Organisation of Councils (AROC) meeting and the WALGA Zone meeting scheduled, on top of the budget workshop and the June Ordinary Council Meeting. Council also has a full day of training scheduled to help us understand our requirements when undertaking the CEO performance review.

Fingers crossed that our community calendars go to plan also, with a few sporting wins and social events to keep the smiles on our faces throughout June.

Overall, I am pleased with how we are closing out 2022/23. ### **Corella Management**

I am pleased to advise that the implementation of the Corella Coordinator is well underway. It is expected that the program between the AROC local governments will commence from 1 July 2023. This is a three year pilot program that will be used as the template for managing other similar pests across WA.

### Thank You to Those Involved in Handling the Ammonium Nitrate Tanker Fire

Both the Shire's CESM Nic Parry and myself have written to all of the external agencies and neighbouring local government volunteers that assisted us with handling the ammonium truck fire on 3 and 4 June 2023 that saw the evacuation of New Norcia. I have also written to the respective local government CEOs as well.

The feedback from DFES is they were very happy with how the Shire managed the incident initially and with the support from others once they and WA Police took control of the incident.

### Local Government Elections 2023 – Owner/Occupier Roll

On the Shires website, you will find information regarding being on the Owner/Occupiers Roll for the coming local government elections on Saturday, 21 October 2023.

We currently have a number of people on the owner/occupier's register. As they are all owners of property in the Shire, they do not need to re-register for the coming election.

If you are an occupier i.e. someone who lives outside the district but leases property in the Shire, you may be eligible to be on the owner/occupiers roll. Such persons remain on the roll for two elections.

# From the Manager of Finance and Administration: Colin Ashe

As the end of financial year approaches myself and team are progressing the new budget for 23-24 well with the first draft virtually completed and ready for the council briefing session on the 19th June 23. Concurrently business as usual continues particularly around the operation of financial statements 22-23 reporting, management and governance including grant and subsidy acquittal.

After almost a year at the shire and a very stable team there is significantly more corporate knowledge now which is so important to understand the financial and administration history and then how we progress the shire forward in all aspects of service delivery.

#### **FINANCE AND BUDGET 2023-24**

As mentioned this has progressed well and whilst not all activities planned in the Strategic Community Plan are likely to go ahead, there will be significant capital expenditure to achieve outcomes the community have indicated a desire to achieve. All going smoothly during the briefing session, it is hoped to have the budget adopted in Jul 23 and rate notices issued in early Aug 23.

It should be noted that UV valuations issued independently through the Valuer General have increased an average of 25% from this time last year. On one hand this is good as it is an indication of the increase of property values, on the other it may mean some spikes in rates levied for 23-24. The shire's methodology is to discount the rate in the dollar for UV's back to achieve 22-23 rate income, and then increase this by the percentage required to fund its budget deficit. As this is done across the total rate income it will mean there will be this spiking on some properties.

An interim audit was carried out during the month of May 23 through councils auditors and there were no matters provided that was of concern or needed addressing. Whilst stressing this is an interim audit, it is a positive outcome that should provide confidence to both council and ratepayers that we are continuing to practice strong governance and transparency.

### **ADMINISTRATION**

Department of Transport is now up and running back at the shire – the team whilst not inundated as yet, have been challenged (in a good way) for the various transactions so far as they learn the ropes for the first time. Most importantly it has been a positive experience for both customers and staff so far and I appreciate your continued patience as this function progresses. A reminder that licencing is open on Tues 9am to 12pm and Wed 10am to 1pm.

The Administration Team attended the Mothers Day / Biggest Morning Tea hosted by the Calingiri Primary School early in May 23 which was very successful. It is really important that we recognise the females in our lives, often as unsung heroes in our day to day life (I think I was still a sook with my mum till the age of 35 – some would say I still am!). For us at the shire we are very lucky to have a solid team of females and this day was a small way of showing recognition and appreciation to them.

# From the Manager—Works and Services: Silvio Brenzi

Work has commenced on the new ablution block at the Bolgart Caravan Park. The modular panels will be erected during the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of June and will only take a couple of weeks. This will be followed by the internal fit out. Plumbing has been installed to cater for a RV dump point in the coming months. Gas will be supplied for the hot water systems via a 210kg bottle maintained by Kleenheat Gas.








The new boundary fence at Calingiri Landfill will also be completed this month. This funded project through LRCI will assist with maintaining any loose items within the tip site and help with keeping the site secure.

Work has also recommenced on Old Plains Road with LRCI funded vegetation control. This will continue the good work started last year and provide better access for large farm machinery such as sprayers and seeding equipment. The program will be continued in the coming years as part of our general maintenance program in a staged way due to the sheer quantity of work that needs to be done on a lot of our rural roads.

Notice is hereby given that the Victoria Plains Shire Council has resolved, pursuant to Section 58 of the Land Administration Act 1997, to permanently close a 7,729m² portion of the Calingiri-New Norcia Road Road reserve and a 6,488m² portion of the Bin Road road reserve to provide for the future expansion of Cooperative Bulk Handling Limited's grain handling and storage facility in the Calingiri townsite.

### WANTED DEAD OR ALIVE- BRUSHTAIL POSSUMS

An Edith Cowan University research project lead by PhD student Shelby Middleton in conjunction with the WA Museum, is investigating the genetics and taxonomy of brushtail possums across Australia.

The wheatbelt once hosted flourishing populations of this species but they are now largely presumed extinct in the region due to feral predators and habitat loss. Despite this, we believe that they may persist in some small refuge areas particularly around granite outcrops or intact creekline areas with old trees. If you have a reliable sighting, picture or other physical evidence of brush-tailed possums in the wheatbelt we would really like to hear from you.
