The new Council has hit the ground running with our first council meeting on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> October, albeit just 4 Councillors in attendance with an apology from Cr Penn.

The first order of business was the election of Shire President, and I thank my fellow Councillors for their continued support, electing me unopposed to the role for a further two years.

Congratulations to Cr Suzanne Woods for stepping up to the Deputy President role, also elected unopposed.

Council appointed members to the shire's committees and selected our delegates to advisory groups and eternal organisations.

Two development applications were given approval at the meeting.

- Telecommunications Infrastructure on Lot 11 Gillingarra-Glentromie Road, Gillingarra
- A domestic storage shed on Lot 38 Yulgering Road, Calingiri.

Council also received the quarterly review of our implementation plan of the Shire's Corporate Business Plan. The review indicates that the Shire is managing the strategic plan well and major projects are ahead of expectations. Council looks forward to working with our Shire Administration, so we can achieve the significant milestones of our strategic plan.

Part one of the new council induction session was also completed on the 25<sup>th</sup> Oct and we look forward to the second session on the 22<sup>nd</sup> November. Training is a requirement for Councillors under the Local Government Regulations.

## From the Chief Executive Officer: Sean Fletcher

#### **Hello From The CEO**

The local government landscape across WA changed on the back of the local government elections held on 21 October 2023. As you may know, for the Shire of Victoria Plains the size of the council membership was reduced from seven councillors to five. Not only that, but the gender split is now 80% women (4 councillors) and 20% men (1 councillor). I'm not aware of any other council in WA having such a change in representation, although the City of Busselton comes close.

On the 25 October 2025, I conducted the first part of the induction for the new council. This included key updates around the changes to the Local Government Act and new requirements regarding how local governments are to function going forward. Prior to the council meeting I then conducted the declaration of office for returning councillor Pauline Bantock and new councillor Rebecca Johnson. I then opened the council meeting and conducted the election for Shire President. Cr Bantock was elected unopposed. Cr Suzanne Woods was then elected unopposed as the Shire's new Deputy President.

Both staff and I look forward to working with the new look council, which includes the ongoing improvement to services and facilities and delivering key objectives from the Strategic Community Plan.

#### New Feature on the Shire Website - Road Reports

There are two key features regarding roads on the Shire's website. Both can be accessed on the home page and they are:

Road Report. This feature can be accessed by clicking on the Road Report button found on the right hand side of other
access buttons. The purpose of this report, which uses Google Maps, is to show where key road works are being
undertaken in the shire, so that road users can make better informed decisions regarding their travels and road usage;

Road Condition Report. This is found at the bottom of the home page and links through to the Main Roads website that contains information across WA regarding road closures, projects, heavy vehicles and how to report an issue e.g.

damaged signs, debris on roads and so on.



I will also be including shortly on the web page, information regarding the Shire's key projects such as the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network road works, Regional Road Group Projects, replacement of the Piawaning Reverse Osmosis Plant, the development of the Shire's Recreation Plan, to name a few.

#### **Emergency Management and the Hot, Dry Summer Ahead**

President Bantock, Nic Parry and myself have attended a number of briefings around emergency management and the expected bushfire season ahead. This has included a region wide workshop regarding dealing with hazards, in this case an ammonium nitrate transport incident, what to expect from El Nino going forward and matters of resourcing.

Speaking of resourcing, Colin was successful in having the Shire's Bush Fire Brigade allocation increased by a further \$24,000, so up from \$83,000 to \$107,000.

Both President Bantock and I will be attending the Emergency Management for Local Government Leaders course during November.

#### **Christmas and New Year Preparations**

Just so you know, and although it may seem early, it is planned for the Shire to close from Wednesday @ 12 Noon on 20th December 2023 and reopening on 2 January 2024. There will be some staff working during this period of time and also available for emergency call outs. Wishing you all the best for what lays ahead during November.

## **Annual Financial Report 22-23**

The auditors have completed all their requirements and an audit exit meeting with them and the Audit Committee is planned for the 22 Nov 23. The audit also included Annual Reporting on Roads to Recovery funding and Local Roads and Community Infrastructure, both of which were signed off with no audit qualification on findings. Similarly, I am not expecting any adverse findings in the Annual Financial Report 22-23 which means I am planning acceptance by council at the Dec 23 meeting and then electors meeting in Feb 24. Whilst the audit was reasonably smooth in terms of providing the evidence and sampling, it did mean a lot of effort from my team in terms of the continuous back and forth with the auditors. Often this meant having to put down operational tasking in order to address the auditor queries. Accordingly I would like to publicly thank my team and in particular Glenn for coordinating this.

Noting the Bolgart Ablution Block has now been completed over two financial years at a total cost of \$231,657. Ratepayers should also expect significant road construction costs reported for Mogumber-Yarawindah Rd in Nov and Dec 23 as invoices are submitted for payment.

#### **Strategic Planning:**

There are a number of strategic outcomes in progress or to be completed in 23-24 in my area and this includes:

- ICT Strategy
- Rating Strategy
- Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP)

Sport and Recreation Management Plan (SRMP)

This months focus has been on ERP where staff are starting to plan and insert parameters into the operating system with the new Customer Service module set to be completed indicatively by the end of Nov. Concurrently other work is occurring in financial systems and Records to commence shortly.

Recently OPTIUM Pty Ltd undertook a site visit with staff of all towns within the shire to get a visual of sport and recreation facilities within the shire as part of the first phase of the SRMP. There is a number of actions in terms of additional information we now need to provide as part of the data set to progress this. It was also a great learning curve for staff to see parts of the shire and discover new ways of getting to the destinations.

## From the Manager—Works and Services: Silvio Brenzi

Main Roads Contractors have completed the bypass deviation road on Calingiri West Rd near CBH. This will now allow them to commence demolition of the existing bridge which has reached the end of its service life. Materials such as railings and timber beams are being salvaged by the Shire for other works and historical projects that may develop at a later time. The bridge is being replaced with a multiple barrel culvert design in place of a bridge. The current pipework in place is only temporary and larger reinforced concrete pipes will be used for the permanent installation in the current bridge location.





Old Telegraph Rd is approaching the completion of the Roads to Recovery program of vegetation and re-sheeting works for the 2km north of Bolgart West Rd. Shire staff have completed this work utilising local gravel and have stored the excess soil from the verge for rehabilitation on older gravel pit sites. White delineator posts are yet to be installed.

Grant funding to enable the upgrading and consolidation of the Piawaning water supply is under way. The new bore is located on Shire managed reserve just north of the CBH sample office. The pump purchased is solar powered and will then have a new line run down to the reverse osmosis (RO) plant where a new filtration system will be installed. With the higher quality of water being put into the plant, less waste water is discharged by the RO plant and thus a higher efficiency is gained from the bore.



## VICTORIA PLAINS SHIRE WAR MEMORIAL YULGERING ROAD CALINGIRI WA 6569

## **REMEMBRANCE DAY 11TH NOVEMBER 2023**

### **Protocol**

The Australian and New Zealand flags will be flown at the Victoria Plains Shire War Memorial in Calingiri at the peak of the flag masts from 8:00am to precisely 10:30am when they will be adjusted to the half mast position. At 11:00am a minutes silence will be observed. At 11:02am, the national flags will be adjusted back to their peak until dusk.

On the 11th November 1918 at precisely 11:00am. The guns on the Western Front fell silent after four years of continuous warfare.

With their armies retreating and close to collapse, German leaders signed an armistice, bringing the First World War to an end.

From the summer of 1918, the five Divisions of the Australian Corps, lead by Sir John Monash, had been at the forefront of the Allied victory. Beginning with their stunning success at the battle of Hamel in July, they helped to turn the tide of war at Amiens and Villiers Bretonneau, followed by the capture of Mont St Quentin and Peronne, and the breaching of the formidable German defences at the Hindenburg Line in September.

By early October the exhausted Australians were withdrawn from battle.

They had achieved a fighting reputation out of proportion to their numbers, but victory had come at a heavy cost.

They suffered almost 48,000 casualties during 1918, including more than 12,000 dead.

In the four years of WWI more than 330,000 Australians had served overseas. More than 60,000 of them had died.

The social effects of these losses cast a long shadow over the post war years.

On the 11th Month, the 11th Day and the 11th Hour we remember them.





## **VICTORIA PLAINS SHIRE WAR MEMORIAL**

The present War Memorial was formally consecrated and dedicated by Ministers of Religion during the first Anzac Day service at the current site on April 25th 2001. The Memorial and its precincts became known and accepted by the VP Shire Council at the time as the Victoria Plains Shire War Memorial and upon RSL recommendation the Shire consequently accepted ownership and responsibility for it.

This state of affairs was reaffirmed at the February 2014 Council meeting.

Mr Gary McGill was nominated by Council to the position of Warden of the Victoria Plains Shire War Memorial and precinct.

During consideration of the position of Warden the following outline of responsibilities of the Warden were considered and accepted by Council.

- The Warden should demonstrate a deep understanding and commitment to the commemorative sentiment associated with the Victoria Plains Shire War Memorial and its precincts and ensure that the sanctity of the War memorial and its precinct be preserved.
- Provide comment and advice to Council on matters relating to promotion and use of the commemorative site.
- Provide a means of communication between community groups and Council in relation top the
   War Memorial.
- Facilitate a coordinated approach in the provision of commemorative services associated with Anzac Day remembrance service and other historical links with the site.
  - Identify strategies for the development of the site.
  - Examine and recommend to Council the implications of current policies and procedures
    affecting the site in relation to its use and presentation.
  - Make recommendations to Council on budget provision for preventative maintenance and capital items.
- The Warden to defer to advice from the Returned and Services League (RSL) on such matters if required.
