## **Background**

This rates account has been arrears since September 2000. The last payment was made on this account on the 30<sup>th</sup> October 2002, but was only for \$200.00 and did not cover the balance, or the rate arrears. The total amount owing to Council is currently \$1071.00 plus penalty interest of \$42.98. Further we have incurred legal and agency costs in trying to issue a summons for payment. We have a non-service report from the Bailiff.

#### Comment

Numerous attempts have been made to locate the owners at Council's expense and time. These people do not seem interested in the property. They are not in Bolgart, and they are not at the last know address in Ballajura, and neighbours advised they may have moved to Tasmania, but a search on their names in Tasmania has failed to locate them or any living relatives.

#### **Background**

On the 18<sup>th</sup> March 2001, Monique BIRKUS - now MC NUTT made an offer to purchase Lots 5, 6, & 20 from Sandra BURTON, which was accepted on the 19<sup>th</sup> March 2001. However the purchasers could only buy one Lot using 'Key Start' finance, hence alterations where made to the original contract of sale. Page two of the contract of sale was not altered and states, "All as seen on the 18<sup>th</sup> March 2001". According to Ms McNutt, a verbal agreement had been made between Mrs Burton and Ms McNutt (Birkus) to acquire the other lots 6 & 20 separately at a latter date. WA Stamp duty has been paid and the sale proceeded. It then took some time for Ms McNutt, to contact Mrs Burton regarding Lots 6 & 20. A rather unfriendly letter dated 31<sup>st</sup>

January 2004, does indicate that the land should be given to Ms McNutt (Birkus) as per the verbal agreement. Hence a signed, witnessed, and receipted, transfer of land for Lots 6 & 20 Landon Street Wyening transferring from Burton to Birkus (McNutt), on the 24<sup>th</sup> June 2003.

In keeping with this transfer Mrs Burton has not paid the rates on these blocks, as they are not hers, and Ms McNutt can not be billed until they are in her name. I now no longer have any contact details for Sandra Burton and mail is RTS. I sent the account to receivables management to see if they could locate Ms Burton, they could not. The DLI/ DOLA/ VGO will not finalise the transfer of ownership as the witnesses to Sandra Burton & Shane Thomas signatures did not record their address, and the consideration says nil, when it needs to say gift.

#### Comment

I cannot locate Mrs Burton or her partner at this time. It is not possible at present to have the rates transferred legally to Ms McNutt. This matter is causing Ms McNutt a great deal of distress.

#### **Background**

Each year Council is required to complete a compliance audit return to ensure that the operations of the organisation are complying with the Local Government Act 1995 and associated regulations.

#### Comment

This report aims to highlight the areas of non-compliance, and detail remedial action proposed to be taken in regard to instances of non-compliance.

The two items of non-compliance were relating to policies;

- 1. The code of conduct is to be updated immediately following each ordinary Election Day, and this has not been done as the code was updated as part of the policy review in April just before the election.
- 2. Council does not have a policy relating to employees who, when terminating receive a payment in addition to their entitlements under the award or contract.

The remedial action proposed in relation to these items of non-compliance are;

- 1. The annual policy review is to be conducted again in April and the code of conduct will be reviewed as a part of this process. The requirement to review the code immediately after an ordinary election day will be noted in the policy manual to ensure future compliance.
- 2. A policy relating to payments in excess of entitlements under an award or contract for terminating employees will be drafted and included in the policy review being conducted in April.

Council is required to adopt the return and endorse remedial actions before the return is submitted to the Department of Local Government and regional Development.

All items of non-compliance listed on the 2002 return were met in the 2003 year.

## Background

Councillors will recall planning approval with conditions being granted to Mr R Galbraith in December 2003 in respect to the relocation of a timber framed bungalow to Lot 183 George Street Bolgart.

Over the Christmas break a section of the dwelling was relocated to the site contrary to the planning consent conditions and the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960.

A stop work notice was served on Mr Galbraith under the provisions of Section 401 (5) on the 20<sup>th</sup> January 2004.

The notice required Mr Galbraith to submit plans, obtain a building licence and lodge the appropriate bank guarantee or bond by 21<sup>st</sup> January 2004.

Mr Galbraith advised this office on the 21<sup>st</sup> January that there had been a delay in the service of the stop work notice and requested an extension of one week to comply with the directions in the notice. Mr Galbraith was advised by email that the time for compliance was extended to 27<sup>th</sup> January as requested.

To date neither plans of the structure, a bank guarantee or bond have been received at this office. A fresh application for planning approval form was received at this office on or about the 24<sup>th</sup> February 2004. The form was not accompanied to enable the application to be considered by Council so it was returned to Mr Galbraith with a request for the necessary documentation.

#### Comment

At 9.45am on the 8<sup>th</sup> March 2004 I spoke with Mr Galbraith to enquire as to the status of the relocation project. Mr Galbraith advised that it was his intention to withdraw his application to relocate a timber framed structure to Lot 183 George Street Bolgart. It was pointed out that it would be necessary for him to remove the section of the dwelling which has been unlawfully relocated to Lot 183 George Street Bolgart to avoid prosecution. Mr Galbraith has agreed to

make arrangements to have the offending structure removed from Lot 183 George Street Bolgart.

In view of that undertaking it is felt that Council should delay prosecution.

#### Background

An application for planning approval has been received from Gilmac Pty Ltd to construct a \$3M hay processing plant on the site where the existing hay processing plant is sited. The exact location of the proposed plans is yet to be decided. There are two sites under consideration. The final selection of the site will depend on power availability and will be decided in April 2004. Both sites comply with the set back requirements of the Town Planning Scheme.

#### Comment

Lot 3735 is zoned rural under District Town Planning Scheme No. 4. The proposed hay processing plant is classified as a rural industry under the scheme. A rural industry is an "AA" use and a rural zoning an "AA" use and is one which the council may issue planning approval for. Option 1 shows a new entry off Glentromie-Yerecoin Road, should option 1 be selected as the site for the proposed hay processing plant council will require a contribution from Gilmac Pty Ltd to construct a bitumen crossover.
