PURPOSE OF REPORT

BACKGROUND

The LGMA has made available Council Corporate Membership (CCM) for a number of years but this local government has not taken up such affiliation.

COMMENT

As a result of research done by LGMA it is launching a major initiative to use CCM funds raised in 2007-08 and beyond to address two major concerns in the sector. In future some 85% of the funds raised through CCM will be used to address the skills shortage and provide direct funding support to LGMA branches. Therefore the association is very keen to recruit more Councils as corporate members.

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The projects to be funded are as follows:-

- 1. Skills Shortage There is a major crisis in attracting and retaining suitably skilled staff to work in local government in Western Australia. The LGMA views this issue so seriously that nearly 70% of the funds raised through CCM will be used to address the skills shortage. The funds raised for this purpose will be identified separately and reported on regularly.
- 2. Branch Support Strong branches mean a strong LGMA which is for the benefit of the whole sector. A strong branch is one that provides real benefits for its members in terms of regular meetings to discuss topical issues in the sector, seminars and workshops, social events, regional conferences and development support for younger officers. Such events require funds and a well subscribed CCM program means all branches will receive a significant boost in funding. The concept is that the funds raised through CCM will be paid directly to the branch committee which will then have the funds to provide support and training in the region for local government officers. The proportion of CCM funds allocated to branches will be around 15%.
- 3. LGMA Operations The remaining 15% of the funds raised will be used to support general LGMA operations. In regard to the CCM levy by LGMA local governments have been defined as large, medium or small and as outlined above the funds will be allocated to three purposes. We have been classified as a small local government. The fee structure and fund allocations for our classification are as follows – Fee \$600 plus GST Allocation: Skills Shortage Project - \$400, Branch \$100, LGMA \$100.

The benefits of CCM for elected members will be as for previous years. This means elected members pay members rates whenever they register at an LGMA event. This saving will be most pertinent in 2007-08 when several elected members have expressed an interest in attending the Futures Symposium to be held from the 11th to 13th September 2007.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To advise Council of consultation with the Calingiri Progress Association, the Victoria Plains Tourism Association and Lottery West in regard to additional funding for the Calingiri Caravan Park ablution block as per resolution 187/07 from the June ordinary meeting.

BACKGROUND

There has been much discussion in recent years on the condition of the Calingiri caravan park ablutions and the need to upgrade them. Grant funding of \$25,000 was secured in July 2006, the Calingiri Progress Association and the Victoria Plains Tourism Association each pledged \$10,000 and Council resolved to allocate the proceeds of the sale of the Harley Davidson motor cycle won in December 2005 to the project to enable the project to proceed with minimal ratepayer funds.

The balance of ratepayer funds required for the project is \$26,605 in cash plus in kind work by the building maintenance officer.

COMMENT

Council in resolution 187/07 passed in June 2007 asked that the CEO consult with the Calingiri Progress Association, Victoria Plains Tourism Association and grant funding bodies to ascertain if additional funding could be sourced to reduce the input of Council to the project.

The Disability Services Commission advised that they do not provide funding for public buildings of this type and Lottery West advised that they do not fund ablution blocks but may look at some funding for the toilets as a part of the renovations to the Roads Board Building. The outcome of this funding may not be known for up to four months and work could not commence until then making it impractical.

Letters were written to the Calingiri Progress Association and the Victoria Plains Tourism Association inviting them to meet with the CEO to discuss the pledging of additional funds to the project. A meeting was held with the President of the Calingiri Progress Association who advised that they did not want to put all of their money into one project and that \$10,000 was as much as they could offer. Confirmation in the form of an email from their secretary was received and is attached to this report.

The Victoria Plains Tourism Association is not functioning at the moment and although a letter was sent to Kathy Lovelock a person with an interest in the association no meeting has been held with the association re additional funding at the time of writing this report.

Putting aside the grant funding and the windfall proceeds of the motor bike to ask these two community associations to put in another \$6,750 each would have meant that their contribution would have exceeded the shire contribution into what is a shire owned and managed facility.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To provide Councillors with details of the proposal to allow them to make a decision on the merits of the information provided.

BACKGROUND

Councillor Geoff Erickson has raised the possibility of Council reviving the decision made in November 1997 to move the Calingiri Caravan Park to reserve 22222 bounded by Cavell Street, Haig Street and Railway Street. The difference

this time is that Cr Erickson proposes that Council acquires the land and gifts it to a private developer to construct and operate the new caravan park.

COMMENT

There are Council resolutions (716/97 and 7.21 from June 1998) and correspondence dating back to 1997 for Council to purchase the land reserve 22222, (Calingiri Lot 45) for \$10,000 and relocate the caravan park to the site. \$11,000 was included in the 1998-99 budget for the purchase of the reserve however the purchase never occurred. Council files do not provide any detail as to why the purchase did not go ahead and correspondence not in our files has been requested from Land Asset Management Services at the Department for Planning and Infrastructure but was not available and the time of writing this report.

The report attached to resolution 716/97 suggested a cost of up to \$150,000 plus the land purchase to relocate the caravan park in November 1997. Taking into account the provisions of the new Caravan Parks and Camping Grounds Act and Regulations an estimate by the Building Maintenance Officer, who managed caravan parks prior to moving to Calingiri and knows the act and regulations, the establishment of a new caravan park in today's dollars would cost close to \$1 million.

The Financial Assistance Agreement for the Community Facilities Grant at clause 2 (a) states that the funds made available by the Department to the recipient will be used exclusively for the project in accordance with the project application and approved budget as noted in clause 1(a). Clause 1(a) states that the funds are for the provision of an 'Ablution Block at Calingiri Caravan Park' therefore it may not be possible to use the grant funds for an ablution block for the Roads Board Building and while the Calingiri Progress Association may wish to continue with its contribution if the ablutions are for the Roads Board Building, as it is not a tourist type project the Victoria Plains Tourism Association may not wish to provide any funding for that project.
