PURPOSE OF REPORT

To advise Council of the FESA grant for the financial year 2007/2008 against brigade requests.

BACKGROUND

In February of each year Local Governments are required to submit budget applications to FESA for the forthcoming financial year.

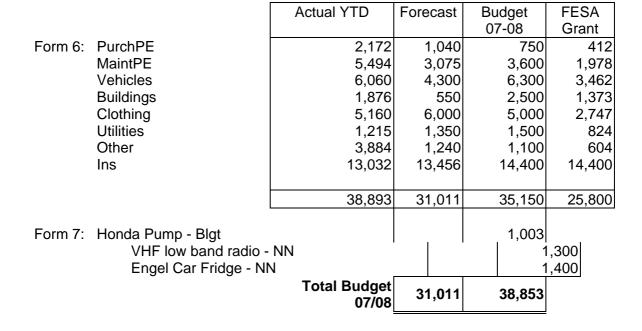
Brigades submit these requirements as part of this process in determination of budget requirements.

COMMENT

Following Brigade requirements for the 2007/2008 financial year a budget request was submitted to FESA amounting to \$38,853. This comprised \$35,150 for recurrent expenditure and \$3,703 for non-recurrent expenditure.

The following chart details the breakdown of this request along with columns for Actual Y T D, Forecast (at time of budget preparation), Budget 2007/2008 Expenditure and the FESA grant provided.

You will notice that the FESA grant for recurrent expenditure is \$9,350 short of what was requested and the non-recurrent expenditure has not been allowed for at all.



There is an appeal process that may be taken and this will be examined to see if an appeal will achieve extra funding. Pending that however, staff need to be advised if Council will support budget expenditure to be in excess of the FESA grant and in line with the Brigades requests.

BACKGROUND

There has been much discussion in recent years on the condition of the Calingiri caravan park ablutions and the need to upgrade them. Grant funding of \$25,000 was secured in July 2006, the Calingiri Progress Association and the Victoria Plains Tourism Association each pledged \$10,000 and Council resolved to allocate the proceeds of the sale of the Harley Davidson motor cycle won in December 2005 to the project to enable the project to proceed with minimal ratepayer funds.

Tenders were called and only one tender was received which did not meet the specifications and was not considered suitable. Negotiations then commenced with various builders who had asked for tender documents and not tendered plus quotes were sought for a site built structure.

COMMENT

As a result of the negotiations for the construction of an ablution block for the Calingiri caravan park Fleetwood Pty Ltd has been selected as the preferred supplier of the ablutions. Fleetwood's quote is for a transportable building with a concrete floor, a similar type of construction to the executive shire houses in Lambert Crescent Calingiri.

The final cost of the ablution block is \$90,540 plus GST which is made up of \$79,308 for the building and \$11,232 for transport, placement, installation and commissioning of the building. The price does not include connection to water and sewerage, which will be done by the shires building maintenance officer, or building approvals and application fees. This will leave Council a cash contribution of \$26,605 plus in kind contribution of the building maintenance officer's time for plumbing connections and finishing off works such as paving.

It is envisaged that the remainder of the works in the concept plan endorsed by Council in resolution 360/06 of November 2006 will be completed in a staged process over the next few years as finances and the building maintenance officers time allows.

This Lot is zoned Residential 12.5 and is 15428.87 square metres in area.

This matter is referred to Council as the floor area and wall height of the proposed shed exceeds the dimensions indicated in the Residential Design Codes of 2002.

COMMENT

Council is the owner of the neighbouring properties to the proposed shed, which resulted in no neighbours being consulted about the proposed shed.

The proposed shed has a wall height of 2.8m and a floor area of 90m². An existing small freestanding metal pergola of 6m² raises the total aggregate of outbuilding floor area on this property to 96m².

This exceeds the maximum allowed shed floor area of 60m² by 36m² and the maximum allowed wall height of 2.6m by 200mm.

This Lot is large in area and is surrounded by public open space on all but the southern boundary, which is land that is also zoned R12.5 residential and is to be considered at some time in the future for the purposes of residential subdivision.

It is considered that a shed of this size on a lot with these dimensions will have little if any impact on the amenity of the area.

Delegation 1.45 is required to be changed by the increase in the tender threshold from \$50,000 to \$100,000 and has been amended to delegate authority to the CEO to call tenders or expression of interest where the consideration under the contract exceeds the amount prescribed in the Local Government (Functions and General) Regulations 1996 rather than a dollar amount. This eliminates the need to change the delegation each time the regulations change and also non compliance where the delegation stated \$50,000 and since March 2007 the contract consideration amount requiring tenders to be called has been \$100,000.

Delegation 1.52 is changed by the introduction of the requirement to have a Purchasing and Tendering Policy and again the requirement to obtain certain quotes where the value of purchases exceeds a certain dollar level has changed with the introduction of the policy. These dollar levels requiring certain quotations and other purchasing guidelines are now contained in the Purchasing and Tender policy adopted by Council in March 2007. The amended delegation allows the CEO to purchase items for which an allowance has been made in the budget subject to the provisions contained in the shires Purchasing and Tender policy and on the basis that the accepted provider is within the budget allocation.

BACKGROUND

Council staff have formed a committee to look at the possibility of installing Photovoltaic Solar Panels at the shire administration building in Calingiri. This committee has looked into subsidies that are available for using solar panels to provide power for the administrative function of Council and to feed any excess power back into the grid.

COMMENT

Council staff have formed a committee comprising of the CEO, Manager Finance and Administration, Works Manager, Building Maintenance Officer and the Executive Assistant to investigate installing a photovoltaic solar panel system to supply electricity to the shire administration office and sell any excess power back into the grid. The purpose of the committee was to look into the subsidies available, the criteria for obtaining those subsidies, whether the Shire of Victoria Plains was eligible for a subsidy and was the project feasible. Other than staff time and telephone calls no money has been spent on the investigation to date with most information gathered coming from government and private service provider websites and telephone conversations with contacts from those sites.

The staff committee has met twice and has gathered a reasonable amount of information and feels that it is time to have Council involvement on the committee and to approve a budget allocation for site specific investigations to take place. The next step moving forward is to have an energy audit conducted and for a consultant visit the office to discuss the feasibility of taking the project further.

The committee would remain an advisory committee reporting to Council without the power to commit Council or Council resources in any way. Therefore as any decision made at committee meetings would need to be presented to full Council for endorsement and Councillor membership on the committee would be minimal staff request the power to vote at committee meetings.
