Mr Gary McGill acting as spokesperson for a group of ratepayers from around Victoria Plains, concerned at the progress of the Calingiri Resource Centre Project without public consultation, addressed Council and asked that a resolution be passed to cease all activities in relation to the project, including funding applications until after a public meeting is held.

Mr McGill went on the say that he believed that there is already sufficient information available for the public meeting to be held.

Mr McGill also said that he had received a report from the Project Officer, Freida Ferguson on the public consultation that had already taken place and he disputed to the contents of the report as most people he spoke to had no knowledge of the project.

Mr McGill called for a public forum to be held in Calingiri after seeding to discuss the proposal.

Mr Duggan expressed the view that there should be four smaller meetings, one in each ward, he went on the say that the delegation was not against the project but wanted a public forum to be held.

Mr Harridge also expressed support for four meetings, one in each ward.

Mrs Edmonds suggested that any one should be able to attend any meeting.

Mrs McGill suggested that a final meeting be held in Calingiri to bring together the feelings of other meetings.

Mr McGill reiterated that a decision by ratepayers does not need to be based on the full financial details, but that a consensus of opinion on the need for the centre be obtained first.

Mr McGill went on to say that Minister for Regional Development Wilson Tuckey has been advised that in Mr McGill's opinion the public consultation process as included in the funding application is not correct.

The question was raised about what funding applications have been approved and/or lodged.

It was also mentioned that a briefing paper should be prepared and circulated prior to the public meetings to allow ratepayers to make an informed decision.

#### **Background**

Council has surplus funds to the value of \$507,938.10 invested in term deposits with the Bendigo Bank for 59 days at 4.79% an approximate yield of \$3,932.83 maturing on the 19 April 2003. The majority of this investment is expected to be rolled over for a further 30 days.

#### **Comment**

The investments with Bendigo Bank are within policy guidelines and as can be seen from the figures below interest in the municipal account is well above budget, although as the spending on capital works takes place the amount of surplus funds available for investment will reduce.

Commissions received from Bendigo Bank have also increased significantly since funds were invested and are now likely to exceed budget while agency expenses are currently well below budget forecasts.

#### **Background**

The Department of Land Administration has contacted the shire re the Westrail barracks in Calingiri as they want to transfer the title to Australian West Railways and they note that we have outstanding sewerage charges on the property.

They have requested that we write off the outstanding charges before the transfer takes place.

#### **Comment**

After reviewing section 6.18(2) of the Local Government act which states "A local government is not to impose a fee or charge for a service or goods under this act if the imposition of a fee or charge for the service or goods is prohibited under another written law." and section 88(1) of the Government Railways act which states "No rate, tax or assessment shall be made, charged

or levied upon any government railway unless the contrary is expressly provided in any act." it is quite clear that we would not reasonably expect to be paid the \$5,155 outstanding for sewerage rates.

The Rail Freight System Act 2000 section 46(1) appears to only provide for a rate exemption on corridor land therefore after the transfer, sewerage and other council rates would be expected to be able to be charged on this property.

The outstanding balance was included in the provision for doubtful debts in the annual financial statements as at the 30 June 2002, therefore to write off the amount outstanding would have no effect on the budget bottom line.

#### **Background**

As a part of the security upgrade being carried out by Bendigo Bank a review of the insurance on the cash kept at the Calingiri agency has been undertaken. This review found that the cash is not currently insured.

As the agency agreement does not directly mention that the cash is our responsibility, our existing cash policy does not include the agency cash.

#### **Comment**

The cash held is owned by Bendigo Bank and they have passed the full cost of insurance cover on to the individual branch, in our case Goomalling. There are two types of cover required, the first being during business hours and secondly whilst locked in the safe/strongroom. The costs quoted for this insurance cover by the banks insurers is \$427.68 for each of the two categories a total of \$855.36.

The board of the Bendigo Bank in Goomalling are reluctant to pass the full insurance costs onto the agency and has asked that Council share the costs 50/50. This amount of \$427.68 could be accommodated within the current agency costs budget.

#### **Background**

Some time ago Council expressed an interest in acquiring UCL immediately North of the Piawaning landfill site. The original intention was to acquire the land for landfill site extension and the winning of gravel. Council was advised earlier this year that CALM would not allow the area to be used for landfill because of native vegetation but Council could share management of the site with WAGR, who already had control of the reserve to win gravel.

#### Comment

Recently advice has been received from DOLA that WAGR no longer has an interest in the site. Since no extinguishing tenure has been held over the UCL site it will be subject to the Commonwealth Native Title Act process. DOLA has invited Council to submit a management plan for the site in order that the native title process can proceed. Inspection of the site reveals that the area has been used presumably by WAGR to win gravel and a quantity of rubbish has been deposited there. Should Council submit a management plan it would be responsible for remediation of the site eventually.

Discussions with other senior staff confirm that gravel for Council use is available nearby and it would be unwise to proceed with the acquisition of the site bearing in mind that it can not be used for landfill and acquisition would make Council liable for remediation of the whole site.

- Asset Management Plans be developed for both the Calingiri and Yerecoin Schemes;
- Undertake risk assessment and contingency planning of the exiting assets;
- Document a procedure of periodic review to assist in keeping the overall asset management system (including the Asset Management Plans) current. Corresponding document control procedures would need to be implemented to identify the currency of the plan being examined.

# Chief Executive Officer's Report to Ordinary Meeting of Council 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2003

#### 1. LGMA Meeting

Held at the Shire of Chittering 7<sup>th</sup> April 2003. The Finance and Administration Manager and myself, attended the LGMA meeting at Chittering. There were several interesting speakers including the President of WA Planning Commission Terry Martin, Steve Tweedie past advisor to the Minister for Local Government and now Local Government lobbyist. John Gilfellon from the Department of Local Government and Regional Development and Wayne Scheggia from WALGA. An interesting tour of the Shire of Chittering development was also undertaken. Some items which need Council input have been extracted for Agenda consideration.

## 2. Visit to Minister of Transport

As Council is aware a meeting was held with Lyn Sherwood the Chief of Staff of the Hon. Minister and John Clydesdale of her Department, on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2003. Council was represented by President Anspach, Councillors Smith and Holmes, the Works Manager and myself. I prepared a submission which was handed to the Government officials in attendance which included officials from Main Roads being the current Regional Manager and the Acting Commissioner John Marmion. Copies have been provided for all Councillors. Though the meeting did nothing to provide us with any certainty in respect to future funding for either AgLime Routes or Regional Road Groups I gained an impression that some funding will be made available for the AgLime Route over a period but we will not know the outcomes prior to the budget delivery. This is totally unsatisfactory for planning purposes but we do not have any options.

#### 3. Elections

As Councillors are aware only three nominations were received for 4 vacancies for four wards in the Council election. Councillors Anspach, Holmes and Woods were re-elected unopposed to the West, South and Central wards respectively and an extraordinary election will be held for the East ward as soon as possible.

It is disappointing that we were unable to fill the vacancies and the fact that we do not have an election can be construed as either satisfaction with the current Council or apathy to Local Government generally.

# Community Services Manager's Report to Ordinary Meeting of Council 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2003

## 1. Mogumber Water Supply

Enquiries have been made regarding a report of an abundant supply of good quality water being discovered West of Mogumber by W R Carpenter Agriculture Pty Ltd. The company Research and Development Officer has advised that to his knowledge no such discovery has been made. A letter has been written and internal company enquiries are being made. A written reply to the enquiry is expected. Enquiries from the Midwest Regional Manager of Retail Services indicates that there are no plans to develop a water source or reticulate water to Mogumber Townsite unless substantial funding is provided and such a scheme could be proved viable. The Water Corporation would consider a joint venture with W R Carpenter Agriculture Pty Ltd and the community should a proposition be put forward.

Neither the Water Corporation, nor W R Carpenter Agriculture Pty Ltd is interested in the provision of a non-potable supply for Mogumber. A written reply to Council's letter is expected in due course.

#### 2. Industrial Subdivision

The installation of the industrial subdivision infrastructure is proceeding with as much haste as can be mustered. The underground power cable has arrived and is being installed together with Telstra cabling on the 14<sup>th</sup> April 2003. The transformer required to complete the distribution of underground power is due to be delivered on 1<sup>st</sup> May 2003.

The next step will be the construction of the access road at the East side of the subdivision and the 10 metre access road on the West side of the subdivision.

#### 3. Neglected Building - 13 Miling Road Yerecoin

The neglected building notice served on Mr W Hall in respect of his property at Lot 13 Miling Road Yerecoin has been ignored. The notice which has been served gave Mr Hall the opportunity to carry out minimal upgrading and demolition work to satisfy community expectations on the proviso that if he failed or neglected to carry out the minimal upgrading work it was Council's intention to serve a Demolition Notice.

Legal advice on the next step is being sought.

## 4. Neglected Building – 32 Miling Road Yerecoin

A licensed surveyor has confirmed that the neglected building owned by Ms A Fraser located at 32 Miling Road is sited over the boundary of the two freehold lots that are the subject of dispute between Ms Fraser and Council. Legal advice is to be sought on the service of a Neglected Building Notice on Ms Fraser.
