PURPOSE OF REPORT

To request Council to approve a budget amendment to the 2016-17 budget to allow for the purchase of a secondhand AD300 Transportable Radar Speed Display (SAM) trailer.

BACKGROUND

In 2014, the Shire of Victoria Plains applied (with the assistance of WALGA) for grant funding to assist with the purchase of a transportable radar speed (SAM) trailer. The application was not successful due to a change in State Government funding policy.

In 2016, the Shire applied again, this time a joint application with the Shire of Toodyay for a shared SAM trailer, also with the assistance of WALGA. That application was also unsuccessful due to State Government funding limitations.

We have now been advised by AD Engineering (manufacturers of the SAM trailers) that they have a secondhand, refurbished AD300 Transportable Radar Speed Display (SAM) trailer currently available for sale. This unit was used by RAC and has a number of extras as detailed in the quote. This pricing is approximately half of the new value for this unit.

COMMENT

Following a review of the current budget, the Deputy CEO and Works and Services Manager have determined that a \$10,000 saving will be made on the purchase of a dolly for the side tipper trailer (COA 40292). It is therefore proposed to utilise the saving to fund the purchase of the secondhand AD300 Transportable Radar Speed Display (SAM) trailer from AD Engineering.

The proposal will have nil effect on the 2016-17 budgeted annual surplus/(deficit).
