PURPOSE OF REPORT: To advise the Works Committee of the application for a permit to use a tri dolly combination on Goudge and Parker Roads Calingiri and the implications for other local roads to enable a decision to be made on the use of this configuration on Victoria Plains local roads.

BACKGROUND: The Shire of Victoria Plains has had most of its roads assessed by Main Roads WA Heavy Vehicle Operations for category 2 and 3 permit vehicles since the introduction of the new system in 2006. A lot of work was undertaken in the last few years by the works crew in tree lopping and replacement of signage and guide posts to lift the roads to the required standard for these vehicles. Main Roads has assessed Goudge and Parker Roads as suitable for tri dolly configurations however Council has to issue a letter giving permission for their use on local roads.

COMMENT: Main Roads has assessed Goudge and Parker Roads for network 4 suitable for tri dolly configurations however Council has to issue a letter giving permission for their use on local roads. The concern is that a tri dolly configuration on a road train allows additional weight to be carried and this may lead to additional damage to shire maintained local roads. There is an argument that the tri dolly distributes the weight over an additional axle therefore there is no additional damage to roads.

The Works Manager was asked to investigate the impact on roads if tri dolly configurations are allowed on local roads in the Shire of Victoria Plains as it is seen as inevitable that if approval is given to one farmer then others including transport operators will pursue the same approval as extra weight can be carried with this configuration. The investigation was difficult as the use of tri

dolly configurations is not common however the information obtained supported the claim that any additional weight is more than compensated for by the additional axle spreading the load.
