Tender RFT 2-2013.14 Re-Construction Edmonds Street Calingiri.

A tender process has been completed for the re-construction works of Edmonds Street Calingiri.

The tender asked for suitable companies to do the required works as stated in the tender.

Tender Assessment

Since the taxpayers' dollar must be spent wisely and in a way that is free from bias, it is important to have an accountable and transparent process. While this tender process can be complex, it offers a proven framework and selection process that is consistent; free from favour; objective; and accountable.

The tender system in which the technical proposal is evaluated and bids ranked separately to the financial offer is scored. It ensures that price does not influence the technical evaluation of the bid.

The tenders must be evaluated on the basis of consistently applied weightings and a consistent consideration of the criteria.

Evaluation and decision making of the results must be in the best interest for Council.

Bolgart Play Area

Work on the site is currently underway with the laying of the soft fall within the play area and beside the skate ramp. The existing sand was removed to the hard pan and gravel and cracker dust imported and compacted by council staff. The day care outdoors area was also prepared with gravel and cracker dust for the imitation grass. Once all the soft fall and concrete paths are in place the grass will be placed.

The footing on one of the shade frames needed to be re-done due to some slight movement when the shade material was placed, the shade was removed, footing repaired, the shade needed to be remodelled to suit the frame, this will be placed once the other construction has been completed, the contractor who supplied the works and shade is responsible for the repairs at no cost to Council.

Maintenance - Grading

Maintenance grading is in progress.

"Area 1"

Being Great Northern Highway to the eastern boundary, Carani Rd to the southern boundary of the shire grading is currently underway. The works are as per the tendered area 3. Gravel is being pulled in from the V drains (where it can be retrieved) and placed back on the road wearing surface, drains are being re-established and getting the shape back into the roads.

"Area 2"

Being Great Northern Highway to the eastern boundary, Carani Rd to the northern boundary of the shire grading is currently underway. The works are as per the tendered area 3. Gravel is being pulled in from the V drains (where it can be retrieved) and placed back on the road wearing surface, drains are being re-established and getting the shape back into the roads.

"Area 3"

Being Great Northern Highway to the western boundary, taking in the Mogumber and Gillingarra and Waddington areas has been completed. The gravel that has been pushed out into the V drain (over many years) has been recovered and pulled back into the road carriageway. Although there are a few sticks and the odd rock pulled up the grading was done as per the specifications of the contract for the first round.

As previously discussed it will take a few more grades to get the results that we require to have the unsealed roads to a better and more acceptable standard.

SUMMARY:

This item seeks Council approval not to award the advertised tender RFT 2-2013.14 being the reconstruction of Edmonds Street, Calingiri to any of the tenders received and that the works be re-scoped to suit the adopted budget 2013/2014 and that council, project manage and complete the works using council staff and selected contractors to complete the works.

BACKGROUND:

As per Councils adopted 2013/2014 budget, tenders were called for improvement works on Edmonds Street. The improvement works include the removal of existing road base material, importation of 150mm base material (MRD standard) gravel, a two coat seal, barrier-mountable kerbing, and the reconstruction of crossovers and paths which are existing concrete (hence have to be removed to be realigned with the new height).

The tender was duly advertised and 11 requests were made for the applicable tender documents.

At the tender closing time being 4.00pm on the 9th August 2013, four (4) submitted tender documents were received from the following companies:-

CONSULTATION:

The advertised Tender allowed 21 days for individuals or companies to submit tenders, which included the opportunity to view and inspect the construction site.

COMMENT:

Tender RFT 2-2013.14 being Edmonds Street Reconstruction (between Yulgering Road and Lambert Crescent) was advertised in local and state-wide newspapers, with the tender closing 4.00pm on Friday 9th August 2013.

Three of the companies submitted alternative tenders along with their conforming tenders. These works involved different methodologies of road construction and one tenderer had cut part of the construction process out as a reduction from the conforming tender. All conforming and alternative tenders were priced above the adopted 2013/2014 budget.

Tender Evaluation

The submitted tenders were evaluated by Council officers:

The initial conforming tenders were assessed for compliance to be afforded a preference in accordance with Regulation 24A-G of the Local Government (Functions and General) Regulations

All tenderers were assessed against the selection weighted criteria, being

Relevant Experience	20%
Key Personnel skills and experience	15%
Tenderers Resources	15%
Demonstrated Understanding	20%
Pricing	30%

The weighted values based on the above and scores out of 100 for each criterion are as shown in the table listed in the attachments.

All the conforming and alternative tenders were evaluated because the conforming and alternative tenders were more than 10% over the adopted budget they were not considered.

Two tenderers had submitted a different methodology (alternative Tender) in road construction using the insitu material as well as imported gravel overlay with cement or lime stabilisation, this methodology has been used extensively in Australia and found to be cost saving, other reasons are that gravel and road building material is scarce.

Conclusion

All conforming and alternative tenders were priced above the adopted 2013/2014 budget, as the all the tenders were over 10% of the budgeted amount there could be no negotiations with the tenderer who could provide the best outcome for the Shire and the project to look into some cost saving areas to get it back to the budgeted amount.

It is proposed to re scope the project to suit the budget, this will mean that we will project manage the works in house using council plant, staff and contract specialised machinery to do the road construction, contract out the bitumen seal, kerbing and footpaths and council staff to do the drainage, clean up and final works of the project.

In the result that the recommendation is approved by council the works program for the construction of works within the 2013.14 year will have to be re programmed.

Recommendations

Based upon the above assessment, it is recommended that none of the tenderers be awarded the tender RFT 2-2013.14.
