# 4.2 Works Manager's Report

# 1. AgLime Route 2 - Construction Progress Report

On the existing 1.80 kms of gravel water binding to be completed at the Calingiri end, tests had been carried out on the gravel material from Irwin Barrett-Lennard's property the results on the gravel showed a high Plasticity Index of 11.1 %. This was too high to meet the standard requirements set by Main Roads WA. The ideal % should be around 7% and the B.C.R. which is the strength of the gravel under load achieved 110 % this is a very positive result and adds to the overall strength of the material hence the gravel can have a slightly higher Plasticity Index.

To overcome the high Plasticity Index AgLime Sands where added and mixed with the gravel to bring the Plasticity Index down to the standard required. The results were achieved and this will give the road a much longer life. This in turn has taken longer to complete this section of road i.e.: mixing and water binding to achieve the results.

The water binding will be completed for the primer seal which will be laid by the end of March 2003. The construction crew will then move into the New Norcia end to complete the remaining construction of approximately 4.30. kms from the end of the bitumen towards the Carani "T" road. At this stage the drainage construction is ongoing and the survey and tree lopping is programmed for the immediate future, to work ahead of the construction crew.

# 2. AgLime Route 2 - Calingiri Goomalling Boundary

#### Gordon Woods Crew

The second construction crew will start the construction of the 1 km section from the Shire Boundary past Brian Slater's property the week commencing the 19<sup>th</sup> March this section will be completed to the Primer Seal stage by the end of April 2003, if not before.

## Councils Capital Works Programme

Gordon Woods's construction crew have completed 2 kms of gravel re-sheeting on Calcarra West and 2 kms on Catabody Road. Some minor drainage work will need to be carried out at a later date at the bottom of the hill on Calcarra West road as this will alleviate water running

across the road causing scouring to the road surface. This could not be achieved prior to construction work starting because of our heavy construction work load.

## Maintenance Grading throughout Shire of Victoria Plains

As Council is aware I have engaged two contractors to carry out maintenance grading works within the shire. This has been a dry grading exercise and is only a temporary fix. Once the winter rains arrive these roads will be picked up again in the normal grading process. The grading contractors have covered the worst areas of corrugated and rough areas including school bus routes. Contractors have graded approximately 180 kms of roads in different areas as directed. If any roads have been missed I would appreciate if Councillors could bring them to my attention.

Cr Holmes advised that he had received a report on the Goomalling East Road – bitumen/gravel section and asked that this road be included in current maintenance grading program as the drop off is very deep.

#### Parks and Gardens

Calingiri football oval and hockey oval are coming along nicely for the sporting events this year. In the last week we have had a contractor engaged with a de-compactor machine that breaks up the clay compacted areas of the ovals and allows water to enter the root zone area. This will improve drainage and generate growth of the playing fields and will also aerate the root zone areas. The water system has been functioning well and scheme water has been used only on very odd occasions throughout this summer.

## AgLime Maintenance Programme

The existing gravel sections of the New Norcia/Calingiri and Calingiri/Goomalling roads have been wet graded. Arthur Jones has been engaged with this project for the past 3 weeks. When winter rains break and we have had enough rain these sections will be regraded and maintained to a suitable standard.

#### Allen Kent

Manager Works Services.

Cr Anspach spoke of his reservations on the initial inspection of the Tree Pruner. His concerns regarding the hydraulics were raised again regarding the numerous repairs to this item.

Works Manager – Allen Kent advised that the machine has now been repaired with 3 new hydraulic motors and hoses have been placed in steel tubing. Repairs have been at the expense of the supplier.
