

NEWS FROM THE CHAMBERS

Maintenance Grading West of the Shire

To allow gravel roads in all areas of the shire to be graded 3 times per year, the area west of Great Northern Highway is put out to tender for contractors to do. This allows shire staff to concentrate on the eastern part of the shire. The contract for the west of the shire was due for renewal and Muchea Grading Contractors were the successful tender.

Bolgart East Road

Work has also commenced on the Upgrade of the Bolgart East Road to widen the seal to a full 7 metres. This work will also include fixing the drainage issues at the corner of Smith Street, Macpherson Street and Bolgart East Road to stop water flooding houses in Macpherson and Nicholas Streets. With the big work load that our crew have to deal with this year contractors were also engaged to complete this work which is funded by the federal governments Roads to Recovery program.

Football Club Pavilion Lease

Council at its March meeting endorsed the signing of a lease to the Calingiri Football Club of the pavilion at the Calingiri Sportsground. The lease commencing at \$2,000 per annum formalises arrangements giving the club control of the pavilion however they have the power to sub lease it out to other community organisations or individuals for functions. The oval remains a public space maintained by the Shire for the enjoyment of all residents.

Planning Approval for Oversized Shed

Planning approval was granted by Council for an oversize shed to be built in Smith Street Bolgart. The large shed is required to safely store the occupiers Bus, caravan and trailers out of sight and will make the block a lot neater. The shed will be at the rear of the block and not easily visible from the street.

Naming of New Norcia Road

Council endorsed the naming of the current portion of the Great Northern Highway which is to be replaced by the new bypass and handed back to the Shire of Victoria Plains to be maintained as a local road "New Norcia Road". Responsibility for naming the road was given to the Benedictine Community as the road runs through their town. Council noted while endorsing the name that when the road is handed back to the Shire that it must be repaired to Main Roads Standards before it will be accepted.

Community Grants For Bolgart and Gillingarra

Council agreed to deviate from the policy on community grants by allowing the Gillingarra Sport and Recreation Club to be paid their 2014/2015 grant funding for the patio that was erected on their hall even though it was completed late. Community grants under Council policy must be spent in the year they are approved and cannot be rolled forward however the Bolgart Progress Association was given permission to carry their 2015/2016 grant forward as the land needed to complete the relocation of the tourism information bay into the town centre has not been released by State Land Services meaning the project through no fault of the association could not be completed this year.

Suicide Prevention Training Grants

Council endorsed a suggestion from Cr Penn that the Shire apply for a Suicide Prevention Grant in the current funding round to train school teachers, Ambulance officers and other interested persons in suicide prevention. Suicide is a major problem in some rural communities and to have people based in our community who are trained to deal with this if it arises will be a good resource to have on hand.





\$2,000 Emergency Services Volunteers Fuel Card arriving this week

More than 90 regional volunteer emergency services organisations in the Electorate of Moore will benefit from a \$2,000 fuel card thanks to The Nationals WA and *Royalties for Regions*.

Member for Moore Shane Love MLA told local organisations who had put in an application to check the mail in coming days.

"The Emergency Services Volunteers Fuel Card (ESVFC) will provide \$2,000 per annum to a total of 807 regional brigades, groups and units across regional WA," Mr Love said.

"This includes regional fire brigades, State Emergency Services, Volunteer Marine Rescue Services and St John Ambulance volunteers."

The \$7.9 million initiative is funded by *Royalties for Regions* and was a major election commitment from The Nationals WA.

"It's a small way of saying thank you to the many emergency services volunteers who sacrifice so much to keep our communities safe," Mr Love said.

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services application process received 807 applications for the fuel card, out of a possible 933 eligible organisations – an uptake rate of greater than 85 per cent.

"It's a great outcome considering this is the first year the ESVFC has been made available."

While applications for the ESVFC closed on January 10, the Department of Fire and Emergency Services have agreed to consider late applications.


"This is welcome news, considering many organisations were busy with the South West fires earlier this year and may have missed out on the application window," Mr Love said.

"Please contact my Dongara office on tel: 99 272333 if you would like further information about late applications.

"The card can be used at the discretion of the brigade as a reward for volunteers who often pay for their own travel expenses when attending emergency incidents or to access training courses out of town."

Full Mobile Black Spot Programme schedule announced

Details of the locations and time-frames of the 128 new and upgraded mobile phone towers to be delivered across regional WA though the Mobile Black Spot Programme have been announced.

The \$385 million program is a joint initiative involving the *Royalties for Regions* funded Regional Telecommunications Project and the Commonwealth Government.

Member for Moore Shane Love MLA said The Nationals WA had unveiled the location of the first 10 mobile phone towers under the Programme last month, and welcomed the full schedule's release today.

"Information on all 128 phone towers being built in regional WA is now online and easily accessible, so local residents can clearly see when and where mobile coverage will be improved in their area," Mr Love said.

"By the end of July 2016, the first 10 sites in WA will be constructed, with many more to follow over the next three years."

Residents of Moore can expect eight new or upgraded towers in the 2016-17 financial year including: Carnamah East, Horrocks, Kalbarri Loop, Latham, Meanarra Hill, Yandanooka, Bindoon West and Seabird.

Among the 10 towers scheduled for completion in 2017-18 are Bunjil, Eganu, Koolanooka, Maya North, Womarden, Merkanooka, Grey, Mimegarra, Pithara and Wannamal East with a further three towers scheduled for construction during 2018-19 at Julimar, Mogumber and Yallabathara.

Mr Love said he understood the anticipation around the build and suggested members of the public track progress using the Mobile Black Spot Site Locator which includes a map and can be found at: www.telstra.com/blackspots

"There are many factors affecting when a site can be completed, including relevant Federal, State and Local government approvals, the scale and complexity of construction required, and whether the structure is new or existing," Mr Love said.

Minister for Regional Development, Terry Redman MLA, announced the full schedule for the jointly funded Commonwealth-Royalties for Regions -Mobile Black Spot Programme this week.

"Royalties for Regions is playing a significant role in transforming regional WA and has so far contributed \$85 million to improving mobile communications across regional WA since 2012, supporting the rollout of 266 new phone towers," Mr Redman added.




